Shark skin feels similar to sandpaper. It's made up of tiny teeth like structures called placoid scales.

Sharks do not have bones. They are a special type of fish known "elasmobranch", which translates into fish made of cartilaginous tissues.

Sharks have been around a long time. Based on fossil scales found in Australia and the United States, scientists hypothesize sharks first appeared in the ocean around 455 million years ago.

Scientist age the sharks by counting the rings on their vertebrae.

Each whale shark pattern is as unique as a fingerprint.

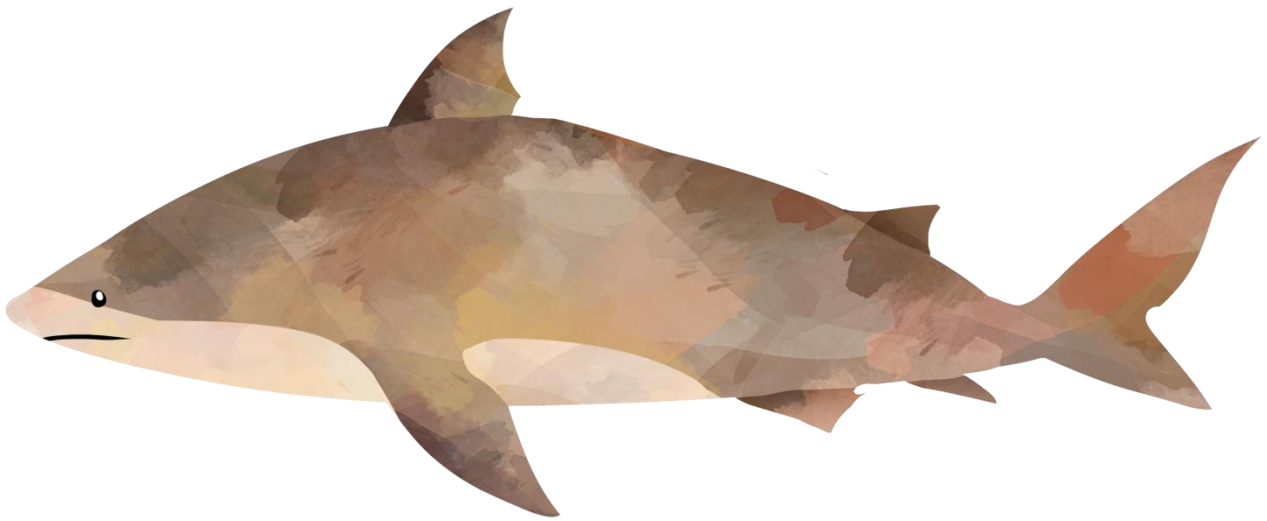
Not all sharks have the same teeth. Mako sharks have very pointed teeth, while white sharks have triangular, serrated teeth.

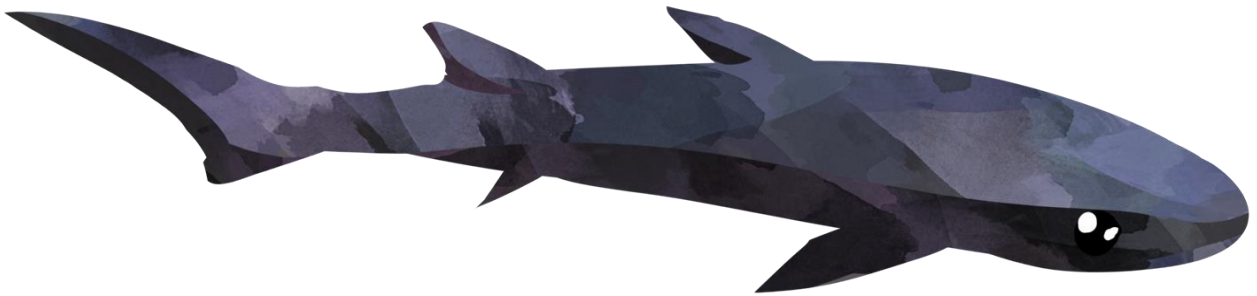
